# FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

This Sunday we celebrate the 12<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time. The last Sunday we celebrated in Ordinary Time was February 23<sup>rd</sup> and then came Lent, followed by Easter time, and then two special solemnities of the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Jesus.

But during that time the Coronavirus Pandemic has ended the world's community from within nature itself. Maybe in time, myths will be created about how exactly it occurred. We live these days with its consequences, even death. The law of Moses indicated how to live free from the virus of sin, but sin prevailed. Now, though sin enters humanity through one "man", grace, the generous overflowing healing, is now entering the human condition through the "Obedient One Man" – Jesus Christ. What a perfect picture these words form, the "Old Adam" and the "New Adam".

Hopefully one day there will be a saving vaccine for us but Jesus is not that at all. The virus has modified the behavior of many of us, but not all, so there are sad consequences of the passing on of the disease. A vaccine will perhaps help with the sicknesses and deaths. Jesus is not a cure-all like that, he is the divine continuation of God's love. He is revealed as an invitation rather than an inoculation. He does not prevent our sins but His obedient life, death and resurrection heals the fractures of our own sense of being receptive to that love.

We do pass on the virus by reckless living. We pass on sin in a similar manner. Jesus, "New Adam", is constantly overflowing with that saving grace. He heals us so as to enter again and again that creating love with which the Eucharist heals us and sends us. As his new apostles are sent, we too are sent to live, not as little vaccines, but as the real presence of the one sent to heal – Jesus Christ our Savior!

# The Nativity of St. John the Baptist - June 24<sup>th</sup>

On December the 25th, we celebrate the big one—the birthday of Jesus, the Word of God made flesh. The Church actually does not celebrate the birthday of the saints, except that of Jesus' mother and one notable exception.

Since we celebrate the birthday of the Word, we also celebrate the birthday of the *Voice*. We're referring to Jesus' cousin of course, John the Baptist, the Voice crying out in the wilderness.

John plays a unique role in the history of salvation. We call him the Baptist. Eastern Christians call him the Forerunner. Only Luke's gospel tells us of the marvelous circumstances surrounding his birth. But each of the four gospels tells us of his essential work in preparing the way for Jesus. But they also tell us something further—that John was a model of the key virtue of *humility* extolled by the first Beatitude of the Sermon on the Mount—*Blessed are the Poor in Spirit*.
