

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

We've been looking at the Gospel According to John. It is very interesting how John reveals the person of Jesus to us.

The Gospel of John actually imitates the Old Testament Book of Wisdom. Wisdom reflects on the defining act of salvation of the Old Testament: the Exodus, God liberating His people from slavery in Egypt. As you know, the Exodus was preceded by ten plagues, or "signs and wonders" that God worked through Moses, leading to the ultimate sign and wonder: the Exodus itself. The Book of Wisdom, however, chooses only seven of the plagues to reflect upon, and then recounts the Exodus.

Similarly, while Jesus performed many miracles (as we know from Matthew, Mark, and Luke), the Gospel of John only tells us about *seven* of Jesus's miracles. And John does not call them miracles, but *signs*. They include: Jesus changing water to wine at the wedding of Cana, the healing of the royal official's son, the healing of the paralytic at the Pool of Bethesda, the multiplication of loaves, the giving of sight to the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus. Actually, that's only six... The seventh and ultimate sign is Jesus's own death and resurrection, the ultimate act of salvation, liberating us from sin and death.

Mission Appeal—Thank You




KELLEY EROH
