

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

We've been looking at the Gospel According to John. Here are just a couple more features of the Gospel before we move on to the rest of the New Testament.

A couple weeks ago, we mentioned that John, in a sense, builds upon Matthew, Mark, and Luke. John is believed to have been the last Gospel to be written, which means the other three Gospels were already known, and John represents a longer period of time to reflect on and understand the mystery of Jesus Christ. One way we see this is in John's understanding of sacraments. Chapter 3 contains a conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus about Baptism. Chapter 6 contains the Bread of Life discourse about the Eucharist. Both chapters demonstrate a deeper understanding of these sacraments. We might also note that John highlights the risen Jesus giving His Apostles the power and duty to forgive sins in His name: the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Finally, we haven't said anything yet about the author. We traditionally identify John as the Apostle John, the brother of James. We should acknowledge, however, that even from early Christian times, there was some question about the exact identity of the author of this Gospel. Nevertheless, there are good arguments in favor of the author being John the Apostle. We should always keep in mind that the Author of the inspired text is God, regardless of the identity of the human authors. The author of this Gospel is also believed to be the author of the three letters of John in the New Testament, and the Book of Revelation, all of which we will eventually look at.
