Dear Parishioners.

At his 1977 Episcopal installation as the Bishop of Oakland, California, Most Rev. John S. Cummins told a story about a friend of his who became a bishop because of his German ancestry and his strong accent, the other bishops jokingly referred to his friend as "The Great German Shepherd."

Jesus is The Great Shepherd. In this Sunday's gospel He tells us that He is the Good Shepherd. He walks ahead of his flock and the flock, and the flock follows him because they recognize his voice. Bishops today are the living shepherds of the great flock of the faithful. They are the leaders of our local churches. The crosiers they carry are shaped like a shepherds crook. Should we go astray, the shepherds can use it to hook our necks and pull us back into the flock.

But Jesus also said, "I am the Gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved." We cannot enter into the Kingdom by climbing over the fence or tunneling under the wall. We must enter through the gate.


