### READING REFLECTION

#### *Pharisaism*

Today's Gospel is about two people in the temple. One is a man of religion (a Pharisee) and the other is looked upon by everyone as a sinner (the tax collector).

In today's terms, the parable might portray two of our contemporaries. One stands up arrogantly and proclaims his innocence of any wrongdoing: he is neither racist nor sexist; he oppresses no one; he is a strong supporter of peace; he doesn't hate anyone; he always gives everyone an equal chance.

The other stands at a distance, acknowledging his own complicity in evil and begging God's forgiveness for his contributions to the presence of sin in the world.

Enough of all this pharisaism! If no one is racist, then why is there racism? If everyone is for peace, then why is there no peace? If we all stand for equal opportunity, then why are so many deprived?

We have had enough Pharisees in our world, and we don't need anyone else to tell us how innocent they are of wrongdoing. It's time for all of us to stand at a distance and acknowledge our own complicity in evil. It's time to stop bragging and to beg God's forgiveness.

*"The structures of our society are subtly racist, for these structures reflect the values which society upholds. They are geared to the success of the majority and the failure of the minority.*

*Members of both groups give unwitting approval by accepting things as they are. Perhaps no single individual is to blame. The sinfulness is often anonymous but nonetheless real.*

**Depression.** We have heard a lot about depression; it is a frequent topic of magazine articles, talk shows and TV commercials. The National Alliance for the Mentally Ill estimates that 15 million adults in the United States experience depression each year. Many of us have struggled with depression at some point in our lives. Feeling sad and exhausted most of the time; sleeping more than normal; not interacting with friends or family are some of the symptoms that accompany depression. What we don't realize is that there may be an underlying physical condition causing these symptoms. One may be a low red blood cell count. A primary physician is the first person to see if you or a friend are experiencing depression. Make an appointment to have your blood count and blood chemistry checked.

## CATECHIST CORNER

### Quiz Corner: Answers to last week's quiz question:

**How do we appropriately prepare to receive the Eucharist? What is the appropriate disposition?**

Catholics should prepare to receive Communion by regular prayer and scripture reading, the sacrament of reconciliation, fasting: the requirement after the Second Vatican Council, requires a one hour fast from all food and drink (excluding water). This may be reduced to 15 minutes for those who are sick or for other important reasons:

--- wearing modest dress to church, and coming to Mass in a prayerful state of mind.

Catholics should refrain from the sacrament when they are not in a state of grace because of mortal sin, unless they receive the sacrament of reconciliation before the Eucharist.

If you're going to receive in the hand, the best way is to put one hand down and put the other hand on top of it and make, as Tertullian used to say, a kind of throne for the Lord. When the priest puts the Host on your hand, you say, "Amen." Take a step or two to the side to make way for the next communicant, then receive our Lord. Communion should not be received on the run, as you're walking back to your place; it should be consumed before you leave the area below the altar.

If you *are* going to receive on the tongue, you should keep certain things in mind. First, the head should be bent back slightly, and the head should be held erect, but kind of tilted back. The tongue should come out over the bottom teeth, equal with the bottom lip, so that the priest has some place to put the Host.

Our disposition when coming to Communion should be one of, "It is the Lord"— is the *Lord* that we are worshiping. It is the *Lord* that we are receiving into ourselves. It is the *Lord* who is giving us in the Eucharist a special way to participate in divine life. It is the *Lord* who is sanctifying us. That should be the overwhelming disposition with which we approach Holy Communion: "It is the Lord!"

## DISABILITY INCLUSION AWARENESS SUNDAY

Each year, in the Diocese of Allentown, all parishes are encouraged to celebrate Disability Inclusion Awareness Sunday on or around the second Sunday in November. This year's celebration will be held on **November 7.** The purpose of this event is to heighten the awareness of the gifts people with disabilities have to offer and to encourage the inclusion of people with disabilities into parish life and ministries.

In addition to identifying a particular Sunday in support of those with disabilities, the Diocese of Allentown has also spearheaded an initiative to designate a Parish Advocate for each parish to further assist our brethren with special needs. The Parish Advocate for persons with disabilities for St. John the Baptist Parish Family is **Nannette Brophy Major.**

As many of you may know, Nannette is the mother of Skye Major. Skye is a 17 year-old parishioner and youth group member. Skye has Down Syndrome and Pervasive Development Disorder (PDD), which is a form of autism. While Skye may experience the physical world differently than most of her peers, she is by no means short of unique gifts and talents, which she enthusiastically uses to enlarge the Kingdom Of God. We are all charged with this task, no matter what our state in life. Skye's entire existence is a ministry; a universal call to simply love. Her part in the Body of Christ, like all persons with disabilities, is crucial, without which, we are all lesser beings.

That said, the Parish Advocate's role is to act on behalf of persons with disabilities to ensure that all are invited to share in the life of the parish. The advocate is a volunteer who serves as a liaison between persons with disabilities and their parish and between the parish and the Office for Ministry with Persons with Disabilities, Catholic Life and Evangelization, Diocese of Allentown.

A disability is defined as difficulty seeing or hearing, moving the body, or understanding everything quickly. It is a physical or mental impairment, which limits a person's life activities. It can be from birth: it can come with age. Approximately one out of 5 members of our parish lives with some type of disability! It is the goal of the church to offer the same respect and opportunities in worship life to all people.
