READING REFLECTION

<u>12th Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> (June 19/20) Reading I: Zachariah 12:10-11, 13:1 Reading II: Galatians 3:26-29 Gospel: Luke 9:18-24

Reflection on the Readings: "But who do you say that I am?"

Peter uttered this bold statement: You are "the Christ of God."

Peter did very well in this statement, and we might think it was the ultimate triumph for God and for Jesus. What more could they want? But Jesus saw instantly that Peter's reply was still an intermediary step. The disciples had moved beyond the gossip stage all the way to the Messiah insight. Jesus had to act quickly so that this new understanding would not become just a thoughtless category for them. He had to tell them the inside of what it meant to be Messiah.

He said,

"The Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised."

Notice that this statement echoes the First Reading for Sunday, written five hundred years before Christ, describes a day of mourning because of "him whom they have pierced." We do not know much about this "suffering servant," but we know that the text portrays Jesus' divinity perfectly. He is the one who was to come, who would gradually teach us God's identity, who would be the one our souls are thirsting for (Responsorial Psalm). He would descend straight into our suffering and would stay with us all the way, not turning back, not forgetting to love us... and yet, we to continue to reflect. Are there any implications for us if we know who Christ is and what his mission is about? If picking up our cross is a formidable task, do we have to think of all the years to come, or could we just pick up today's cross?

Don't count on face lotions and cosmetic labeled with a sun protection factor (SPF) to give you adequate protection. You'd have to apply them thickly enough all over your face and neck, and reapply them often throughout the day, which is not how these products are typically used. And though the SPF numbers are not additive – that is, two products with SPF 15, for example, do not give you SPF 30 – using more than one product at a time may provide slightly more protection simply because you're getting more of the sunscreen ingredients.
